

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# INTRODUCTION

The Government acknowledges women-led development as crucial for achieving the vision of Viksit Bharat in Amritkaal. To promote gender equality and empower women, various Acts and Rules mandate creche facilities. Section 11A of the Maternity Benefit Act (Amendment) Act, 2017, requires establishments with 50 or more employees to have a creche, extending to both males and females. Additionally, Section 48 of the Factories Act, 1948, mandates creene facilities for factories with over 30 female workers. The Plantation Labour Act and the Mahatma Gandhi National Rufal Employment Guarantee Act, 2005, also stipulate creche provisions based on the number of employed women Further, Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 deals with Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). Schedule Villot the Companies Act, 2013 specifies that Companies may undertake activities for promoting gender equality and empowering yomen.

Anganwadi Centres are the world's largest childcare institutions dedicated to providing essential care and support to children ensuring delivery of care facilities till the last mile. In a first of its kind approach, the Ministry of women & Child Development has extended the Services of child care through Anganwadi cum Creche Centres. This will ensure whole day child care support ensuring their well-being in a safe and secure environment. Anganwadi cum Creche initiative alms to increase the Women work force participation in the economy.

It has long been demanded to standardise the procedures for thanagement of creches by any individual/service agencies/corporations/companies/universities/hospitals/care service providers/government organisations/non-government along anisations etc. Accordingly, this document has been prepared by the Ministry of Women and thing pevelopment in consultation with Ministry of Labour and Employment which prescribes the national minimum standards and protocor for setting up and running of creches in India, emphasising the institutionalisation of care services to support and promote female labour force participation.

# National Minimum Standards and Protocol to Set up Creche

The active participation and leadership of women are vital for women-led development, institutionalisation of care services is crucial for enhancing female labour force participation-suggestive standards and protocol have been formulated for setting up creches by any individual/ service agencies/ corporations/ companies/universities/ hospitals/ care service providers/ government organisations/ non-governmental organisations etc., addressing the minimum essential requirements. These standards and protocol aim to provide dimprehensive childrare in a safe and secure environment, fostering the overall development of children. Additional facilities may be incorporated to further enhance the well-being of children. State Governments and UT Administrations are also advised to adopt these standards and protocol for setting up and management of creches.

## 1. Definition of Creche


A Creche is eare centre that provides a safe and nurturing environment for children wille their parents or guardians are at work. These facilities prioritise the children's health provide supplementary nutritious meals, and maintain a secure and safe environment. It provides age appropriate educational activities to boostholistic development of the child.

# 1.1 Objectives

- l) To provide care facilities for children of parents/guardians who are engaged in any work
- II) It offerasecute and safe environment to the children.
- iii) To ensure "women-led development"
- iv) to emerge as a new service sector which provide job opportunity to women.
- To encourage women to pursue their career and seek further employment or portunities.
- V). To promote female labour force participation in the economy...
- vii) To envisage new educational sectors in the form of training institutions with globally recognised certification courses.

# .2 Key points to be considered prior to opening of a Creche:





- (ii) It is ideal to have creche flear the homes of children or near the place of work of the parents/guardians
  so that parents/guardians can be contacted in case of emergencies.
- (V) The provision of care services at horde may also be provided on regular/day/hour basis.
- v) It's preferable for creches to be set upon the ground floor for ease of access and convenience. However, if it's or other floor all necessary safety measures must be adhered to
- vi). The creche simings may be demand based and mutually decided by creche administration and parents/ guardian.
- vii) Number of noons may be as per the requirement depending on the humber of children. However, rooms should have sufficient space with facilities for resting and study for the children with ventilation and light arrangements.
- viii) The windows in the creeke should be positioned at an appropriate height and should be properly fences to prioritise safety of the children.
- ix) Creche must have a child friendly tollet with running Water facilities; a urinal, Tollets/wash basins must
   have soaps/hand wash induid; the needs of specially abled children should also be kept in mind,
- X) Hygiene inside and outside of creches should be maintained properly.
- xl) and the centre must have safe arraking water facility preferably with water purifier
- xii) . . Food provided to the children can be inutually decided by ereche administrator and the parents/guardian
- Aiii) Play materials and toys ressential ECCE Study material and play materials, sports materials, biocks etc.)
   Should be provided to the children, Audio visual equipment may be provided where appropriate and feasible to study age-appropriate learning and Cognitive development.
- xiv). The crecke should have child triendly spaces that are designed and tailored specifically to cater to the needs, —safety of the children.
- xv) Important and Emergency contact numbers (helplines like 112, 1058, fire services, child Protection Officer, Nearest Police Station etc.) should be displayed on essential information poards for easy access and reference
- xvi) Regular inspection for food safety and hygiene are crucial to ensure the quality of the food.
- XVII) It is manuatory that CCTV cameras are installed for ensuring security and supervision at the creche Parents/ Quardians may preferably be provided with access to CCTV cameras, wherever possible, enabling them to monitor the creche remotely from their workplace.
- XVIII) The local police stations, the Women and Child Development/Social Welfare Department, and the Labour

  Department should invariably have the information about the location and details of the creche for safety

  purposes and information to be maintained by these offices
- xix) Services for creche facilities to be set up based on termand user Charges may be collected by service provider based on services offered.
- (x) If any dispute arises between service provider and the parents/guardian, the creche administrative committee.
  Will settle the matter if any matter comes to the notice of government and if an intervention is required it may be taken up as appropriate.
- XXI) Crèches should strictly follow all the rules acts related to colld protection.

# 1.3 Crèche Administrative Committee

The indicative composition of Creche Administrative Committee is as follows

- i) crethe Administrator To be nominated by institution/organisation operating the creche
- ii) Creche supervisor
- iii) Parents/ Coardians (preferably 3) of beneficiary children



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# 1.4 Staff or Resource person requirements

#### 1.4.1 Number of staff

There should be at least 1 creche supervisor and one creche helper for handling 20-25 children. Additional care "staff can also be engaged in case the children require personal care.

### 1.4.2 Qualification of the staff

- The staff should preferably have a years experience of working in the childcare sector, either in a professional setting or as yolunteer. Persons holding a diploma in Childcare or Nursing may be professed.
- iii) Only women staff to be recruited as caregivers for the children.

### 1.4.3 Prerequisites for hiring

- i) -- Police Verification Certificate
- II) = Character certificate
- III) ---- Medical certificate

# 2. \* Roles and Responsibilities

### 2.1 Creche Supervisor.

- The creche Supervisor will be the overall in charge of the creche.
- ii) Planning and implementing age appropriate educational activities to joster holistic development of the children.
- iii) : To maintain/monitor records of children's attendance and other statutory records:
- (v) To liaise with creche committee, parents for their support and incorporate their suggestions and recommendations in the functioning of the creches.
- Y) Establishing open communication with parents or guardians, about their child's development and any
  concerns or events at affective.
- Creche sopervisor should actively promote daily stimulation, based activities on Early Childhood Care of Development (ECCD) to promote physical, mental and cognitive development of children.
- vii) Any other responsibilities as decided by creche administration.

#### 2.2 — Crèche Helper (s)

- i. Creche Helper would be responsible for providing assistance to the creche worker.
- I The Creche Helper will assist the creche supervisors in dally tasks.
- ili. Felper should have a passion for children and exercise patience with them
- iv. Helper should constantly monitor and supervise the children to ensure their safety.
- v. \_\_\_ Ensuring the facility is clean, safe and well-maintained.
- vi. Any other responsibilities as decided by creame administration.

# 3. Services provided in the Creche

## 3.1. Parent/Guardian and Administration meeting

Creche administration should organise at least one parents/grardian meeting every month and review the performance and process of children Feedback from parents/guardian may also be recorded for further amprovement.

### 3.2 Engagement and training of creche workers

- Irained creche worker is a prerequisite for operating the creche, well trained staff with prior experience
   related to childcare, norsing early childhood care and education can play a crucial role in the efficient operation of a creche.
- ii) Creche Administrators may ensure continuous training for creche workers and helpers, in areas such as Nutrition, Childrene, EECE, Child Rights, Child Protection, and Child Legislations. Seminars/ Workshops may also be organised by with the help of experts from Government Institutions or Other Organisations etc. for the capacity building and enhancement of the skills and knowledge of Creche staffs.

# 3.3 Health, Medicine and First Aid Kits

- The centre should be well equipped with basic First Aid & Medical Kit.
  - li) The centre should have a fire extinguisher.
- iii) The creche should have working arrangements with nearest available health facility to provide introductions in case of emergency.

#### 3.4 Record maintenance

The Creche worker and helper are required to maintain the following basic records and registers:

- Admission/Enrolment register for recording profile of children and their guardians including profession
  of parents/ guardians
- II. Attendance registers of children
- The medical record of children.
- IV Guardian's meeting register.
- v. Visitors register
- vi.... Inspection register

# 4. Safety Inspection

- Safety inspections should be conducted by an administrative committee dedicated to overseeing safety standards within the creche.
- iii). Community based inspections may be carried out at regular intervals, at least one in a quarter, to ensure that the crecine is working in a child friendly manner and have all the minimum required facilities/systems. In prace.
